



Visitation Fact Sheet During the COVID-19 Pandemic

- Visitation permitted 7 days per week between the hours of 10am-7pm.
- Visitation **by appointment only and for a maximum of 2 hours.**
- Visits should be scheduled through <https://book.appointment-plus.com/d1hnjrqe/>
- Visitation appointments are for a maximum of 2 visitors per Resident at a time. (unless previously approved).
- Visitors under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult age 18 or older.
- Visits take place in the Resident's Room*, Backyard (weather permitting), Tea Room or Private Dining Room.
**While all Visitors are encouraged to visit in Resident Rooms, it is strongly recommended (if possible) that Residents on Hospice receive visitors in their rooms.*
- Elevator usage for in room visits must be limited to no more than 3 occupants at one time.
- All visitation must be conducted with strict adherence to the Core Principles for reducing the risk of COVID-19 transmission and be in accordance with The 80th Street Residence's adopted and effective visitation plan.
 - Screening of all who enter for signs and symptoms (temperature checks, questions and observations for signs and symptoms). Denial of entry of anyone with signs/symptoms or who had close contact with a COVID-19 positive person within the prior 14 days.
 - Hand hygiene (preferably alcohol-based hand rub)
 - Use of face coverings or masks covering both mouth and nose
 - Social distancing between persons, at least 6 feet
 - Adherence to signage throughout facility including proper visitor education on signs and symptoms, infection control precautions, use of masks, specified entries, exits and routes, hand hygiene, etc.
 - Cleaning and disinfecting high frequency touched surfaces and designated visitation areas often and after each visit
 - Appropriate staff use of PPE
 - Effective cohorting of positive or presumed positive residents to the greatest extent possible



- **Residents in isolation or observation and residents with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 diagnosis, irrespective of vaccination status, should not have visitors outside of compassionate or end of life care**

Compassionate care and end of life visitation will be permitted when visitation is not otherwise permitted in accordance with the DOH's current visitation guidance.
